## DH Conference Issue

1. PC Chair sends EIC a list of the guest editors so they can be granted Associate Editor's rights in order to facilitate their work on the issue which will be done entirely in the DSH online management system.
2. PC Chair sends out a call for submissions [please amend where wanted and complete the list of guest editors]:

DSH. Digital Scholarship in the Humanities will publish a supplementary issue of top papers from Digital Humanities [yyyy], the annual conference of the Alliance of Digital Humanities Organizations, held this summer in [Place]. We invite submissions from anyone who presented at the meeting, including those who gave long and short papers, or who participated in panels and poster sessions.

Long articles of up to 6,000 words in length (notes & bibliography excluded) should take up theoretical issues in digital humanities or report on completed work, including at least preliminary evaluation of its results. While there is more room in shorter articles for description of work at earlier stages, we emphasize that short papers of no more than 2,000 words (notes & bibliography excluded) should make scholarly points and not merely report on DH project activities. All submissions will be evaluated by at least two independent referees.

Submissions must be received by midnight GMT on October 15th 20xx.

Interested authors should:

1. Contact [name lead guest editor] ([email lead guest editor]) as soon as possible to inform the editors of an intention to submit.

3. Submit manuscripts directly to the DSH submission site at <https://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/dsh> by October 15th 201\$. Please make clear in your cover letter and in step 5 of the online submission procedure that it is for the 'DH20xx issue'. We emphasize that it is the author's responsibility to see that DSH's formal guidelines are met, including the proofreading by a native speaker of English. All content from this special issue will be released freely accessible to all by Oxford Journals thanks to a generous grant of ADHO. Authors retain their copyright, may make pre-prints available without restriction, and may share post-prints after a 24-month embargo. 3. EIC sets up a mail template for the guest editors to invite reviewers which is accessible from the Associate Editor's dashboard. As the guest editors are assigned as associate editors, they can select this mail template to send to the reviewers they want to invited. All personal details of the guest editors, paper and reviewer are filled in automatically by the system:

Once you accept the invitation to review this manuscript, you will be notified via e-mail about how to access Manuscript Central, DSH's online manuscript submission and review system. You will then have access to the manuscript and reviewer instructions in your Reviewer Center.

4. Guest Editors think of a minimum of three potential reviewers for each submission: 1 internal reviewer taken from the guest editors and 2 external reviewers.
5. Guest Editors appoint a lead editor per paper and send EIC an overview [spreadsheet] with the authors, titles and lead guest editor whom will be assigned as an associate editor (AE). Please notice that the AE cannot be a reviewer of the same paper.
6. The AE invites the peer reviewers using the Scholar One System. The system is quite straightforward and self-explicative, and a manual is available in the top right corner of each screen. AE's are not limited to assign people who are already registered in the system and can also create new accounts. Please check whether they are registered or not before doing

so.

7. Peer reviewers submit their review
8. Once the desired amount of reviews have been received, the EIC will draw up a table of the results and suggest a decision (accept, accept with minor/major revisions, reject & resubmit, reject). The AE's confirm or object to the decision and come to a conclusion. AE advises the EIC on a decision on the manuscript, based on these reviews. The EIC will confirm the AE's decision.
9. The EIC communicates the decision to the authors who react appropriately (revise their paper).
10. On submission of the revision, the AE invites the peer reviewers for a second round, followed by a recommendation to the EIC and a communication to the authors.
11. A final decision is cast on the revision by the EIC.
12. Papers are sent to production by the EIC.
13. The Guest Editors upload their Introduction in the DSH online submission system.
14. Papers are published in advance access.
15. The issue is published online.
16. The issue is published in print.
